

Schoolhouse Museum Theme for 2026

Next year we will focus on “Old” versus “New”, “Extinct” versus “Current” or “Ancient” versus “Modern”. The terminology is dependent upon your viewpoint. The areas we will focus on are things from everyday life such as cooking, heating, communication and transportation, and how they have changed over the years. For example, cooking used to be done on stoves fueled by wood. Now our stoves are fueled by gas or electricity, and we supplement them with microwaves, air fryers, and crockpots.

For verbal communication, phones over time have had cranks on them, rotary dials, party lines and/or appeared in booths outside gas stations and party stores. Now most of those are gone and have been replaced with cellphones. For written communication, hand-written mailed letters with stamps have been replaced by texts, emails, and Facebook messages.

To get from one location to another before the advent of automobiles, the options were by foot, horse, or in some cases by bicycle. Now in addition to automobiles and motorcycles, there are e-bikes, 4-wheelers, and side-by-sides.

The Lovells Fire & EMS Department is comprised of 15 dedicated professionals who serve the safety needs of Lovells Township. Each member demonstrates a strong commitment to community service through their volunteer efforts, which include responding to emergencies, supporting township events, and actively contributing to the well-being and safety of residents.



The Lovells Fire & EMS Department hosted an information event on Home Fire Safety, November 17, 2025 for the residents of Lovells. This event focused on home fire safety, types of fire extinguishers, the importance of having fire escape plans, as well as a "hands on" experience of using a fire extinguisher and putting out a fire.

Do you have your "Dump Permit"?

All Lovells residents should have their green dump card. If you need a card, Lovells Township Residents may obtain a "Dump Permit" during regular Township business hours.

Large Items

A Large Item Disposal Ticket and a dump permit are required in order to dispose of larger household items (chairs, mattresses, etc.) at either location. Large item tickets can be purchased at the Township Hall, Kelloggs Bridge Grocery, or Lovells Home Center.

Metal Recycling will resume in the spring!

Some Transfer Station Prohibited Items:

- Construction Materials
- Medical Waste
- Dead animals, fish of any size, or entrails of game or fish
- Beverage containers that require \$0.10 deposit
- Whole motor vehicle tires
- Yard waste (leaves, brush, tree limbs etc.)
- Used oil, Cans of paint
- Lead acid batteries, Regulated hazardous waste
- Liquid waste,
- Sewage, PCBs, and Asbestos waste.
